Mostly clear skies and higher temperatures were common across Oklahoma Tuesday, although gusty winds increased during the afternoon across the West. Reported gusts of 40 mph around 4 p.m. Tulsa's high was 54 after the overnight low of 28 surpassed by three degrees the previous low of the 1978 fall season.

Although considered a favorite since setting a national collegiate record by gaining over 200 yards in three straight games at midseason, Sims thought his fumble in the closing minutes of OU's 17-14 loss to Nebraska would keep him from winning the trophy.
