VESSELS CAPTURES HEISMAN TROPHY AS TOP FOOTBALLER

GOTHAM WRITERS PICK OKLAHOMAN OVER TERP STAR

NEW YORK, Nov. 25 (UP)—Billy Vessels of Oklahoma tonight was awarded the Heisman trophy as the nation's outstanding football player.

The senior halfback, a native of Cleveland, Ohio, will receive the trophy Dec. 2 at the annual dinner conducted by the Downtown Athletic Club in New York.

Other voters and their points: Don Moomaw, UCLA, 257; Jack Latimer, Notre Dame, 233; Jack Cameron, UCLA, 222; Don McLaughlin, Michigan, 164; Don Heinrich, Washington, 150; Leon Harceman, Georgia Tech, 140; and Eddie Crowder, Oklahoma, 135.

Vessels has one more game before he concludes his collegiate career, that against Oklahoma A&M Saturday. He has scored 160 yards rushing and caught six passes for 141 yards.

Vessels is the leading scorer in the Big Seven with a total of 136 points. He has scored all three O. T.'s against Notre Dame.

SOONER QUARTET, INCLUDING BILLY, BOOST A-A STOCK

KANSAS CITY, Nov. 25 (UP)—Players from 10 Oklahoma Sooners football teams boosted their stock in the closing race for all-America football recognition from the sprawling Missouri Valley area.

For the fourth straight week three backs and a linebacker of the University of Oklahoma were nominated by the Valley All American board. They were quarterback Eddie Crowder, halfback Billy Vessels and fullback Rock Mophal.

Offensive fullback Howard Waugh of Tulsa, another old-timer on the weekly nomination, and teammate end Tom Miner each were cited for their performances as the Hurricane whipped Arkansas 45-14 last Saturday.

Waugh ran wild for the Gator bowl bound Tulans, picking up 200 yards in 19 carries. He scored 12 touchdowns, a field goal and five placements.

Miner caught three passes for 64 yards. He's second in rushing yardage with 322 yards, a field goal and five placements.
